

The Village is currently working on the revision to the 20 Year Comprehensive Plan as required by state code. The current plan was adopted in July of 2008. It is very interesting to see what has actually changed and what has been implemented in the past 10 years.

When we wrote the plan 10 years ago, our 20 Year Vision Statement stated that "In 2025, the Village of Lena is a healthy and vibrant community lead by progressive government officials and community leaders. The village's diverse economy is comprised of industry, commercial services, and professional occupations that offer family supportive wages. The combination of affordable residential housing for all age groups; plentiful recreational and cultural opportunities; and a school district viewed as an academic leader makes Lena attractive to families seeking a community with strong qualities".

Ordinance 134-3. Regulation of length of lawn and grasses.

(B) The Village Board finds that lawns, grasses and noxious weeds on lots or parcels of land which <u>exceed eight (8) inches</u> in length adversely affect the health and safety of the public in that they tend to emit pollen and other discomforting bits of plants, constitute a fire hazard and a safety hazard in that debris can be hidden in the grass, interfere with the public convenience and adversely affect property values of other land within the Village..... (G) (2) Failure to comply the Village shall cut or cause to cut all grass and weeds from the property and shall charge the expense of so doing at a rate established by resolution by the Village Board. <u>Please do NOT blow your grass cuttings into the street. It plugs the storm sewers! A notice will be published in the Oconto Reporter, Village website and this newsletter. No other letters will be sent. Possible citations for offenders.</u>
