President's Message—Steve Marquardt

Season Greetings! Hard to believe it is December and no measurable snow on the ground and temps have been very mild. I hope that doesn't mean a brutal January!

What a busy year it has been. The Village undertook several projects this past year. The most noticeable was the Village Hall facelift and parking lot repavement. Both of these projects were funded by COVID Relief funding through the federal government and the Village building improvement fund. The Village Hall meeting room has been updated and we were able to increase the usable square footage with removal of the old storage cabinets. New rolling tables/chairs and a large monitor were also added to improve meeting presentations. Fluorescent fixtures were upgraded to LED lamps for better lighting taking advantage of rebates from Focus on Energy. New flooring and millwork completed the project. A special thank you to Ed Patenaude for his direction throughout the process.

The Village formed a new Park and Recreation Committee this year that was tasked with evaluating our current park areas and determining needs to improve existing areas and develop a plan for new recreational opportunities. Great progress was made over the past several months on the new park area being created near the water treatment building in the Rosera Business Park. Phase 1 of the plan, 2 new youth baseball diamonds should be ready for play next season. This phase of the project was made possible by the generous heavy equipment donation from Holtger Bros. Inc. and over 300 hours of equipment operation by several volunteers. Ken Duhm and the Lena Sod Farm also contributed to the building of the diamonds by providing the seeding of the outfield and donation of a couple of loads of sod next spring to complete the diamonds. The Youth Baseball program had more than 120 boys and girls play ball this year so the need for ball diamonds was great. The Committee is actively pursuing donations and grant opportunities to cover the expenses of this phase of the park plan. A conceptual layout of this new area is on display at the Village Hall.

The Village also completed the first round of sidewalk restorations along Main Street. This work was long overdue and will continue next year as another round of sidewalk repair will occur in the Spring. The DNR Clean Water Fund leaders notified us this week that the upcoming sewer plant rehabilitation project will be eligible for nearly \$750,000 of grant monies with the remainder of the project expenses through a low interest loan via the same program. This financial assistance was made possible by working with our Engineering firm Ayres Associates who submitted all of the required paperwork on behalf of the Village. This project is scheduled to start next summer early fall.

Our Village of Lights event was a success again this year. We thank all of the local businesses who participated. Businesses and residents went all out this year to dress our village in Christmas lights, decorations and displays. Our lighted village looked fantastic! It doesn't go unnoticed as we hear numerous comments from visitors of our village on how wonderful our town looks for Christmas. If you haven't already done so, take a ride through the village and enjoy!

I would like to thank the Village Board, the Committees and all of the employees for their dedication and work over the past year in trying to make our Village a great place to live. A special thank you to Larry Shallow who retired Dec 1st after 39 years of service. We will miss his knowledge of Village landmarks and Public Works history. Congratulations Larry, enjoy retirement!

Curbside Garbage Pick-Up

Garbage pickup is at 8am, every Tuesday. Please have your garbage curbside by then. Garbage must be in Village of Lena bag for pickup service. Bags are available at the Village Hall, Recycling Center and at the Lena Library. The cost per bag is \$1.50.

Garbage bags must be tied. 40 lb limit per bag.

Property Taxes

Please pay with Check/Money Order. Taxes may be paid in person, by mail or use the drop box just outside the front door of the Village Hall until January 31, 2024. After that date you must submit payments to the Oconto County Treasurer.

Winter Reminders

Winter parking rules are now in effect. No vehicle is to be parked on the street between 2:30 a.m. and 7 a.m., December 1-April 1. If you have tenants that do not receive this notice please inform them. Parking citations will be issued for non-compliance. (Village Ordinance 302-16)

The Village of Lena will be implementing a new street snow removal process to protect our sidewalks. If your property has a sidewalk, you are required to have the snow cleared within 24 hours of a snow occurance (see Village Ordinance 277-10 below). The fee for the Village Public Works Department to remove sidewalk snow is a minimum of \$150 per occurrence. Please make sure when removing snow that you blow the snow toward your property and not onto the street.

§ 277-10. Snow and ice removal.

- A. Removal from sidewalks. The owner, occupant or person in charge of any parcel or lot which fronts upon or abuts any sidewalk shall keep said sidewalk clear of all snow and ice. In the event of snow accumulating on said sidewalk due to natural means and/or by any other means, said sidewalk shall be cleared of all accumulated snow and/or ice within 24 hours from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. Sidewalks are to be kept clear of snow and ice to a minimum of four feet in width. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the owner, occupant or person in charge of the parcel or lot which fronts upon or adjoins said sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk sprinkled with sand and/or salt to permit safe travel by pedestrians. No person shall push, shove or in any way deposit any snow or ice onto any public street, alley, sidewalk or public lands dedicated to public use, except for parcels or lots located where existing buildings are constructed within five feet of the street right-of-way and the sidewalks exist from the Village right-of-way to the curbline. In such instances, the owners, occupants and/or employees of parcels or lots shall be permitted to deposit snow and ice from their sidewalks onto the public streets.' [Amended 12-16-1996]
- B. Enforcement. All sworn police officers and other designated Village officials and employees are hereby authorized and directed to enforce the provisions of this section.
- C. Continued violations. Each twenty-four-hour period where a violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense under this section for enforcement purposes. Repeated violations or subsequent additional accumulations of snow and/or ice shall not nullify any pending notice issued under this section.
- D. Abatement after notice. Failure of the owner, occupant or person in charge of any parcel or lot to cause the removal of snow and/or ice within the time established under Subsection A shall result in the Village causing the removal of said snow and/or ice. [Amended 12-16-1996]
- E. Expense. An account of the expenses incurred by the Village to abate the snow and/or ice hazard shall be kept, and such expenses shall be charged to and paid by the parcel or lot owner. The minimum charge for manual sidewalk snow removal by Village personnel shall be set by the Village Board. Notice of the bill for the removal of snow and/or ice shall be mailed to the last-known address of the owner of the parcel or lot and shall be payable within 10 calendar days from the receipt thereof. Within 60 days after such costs and expenses are incurred and remain unpaid, the Village Clerk-Treasurer shall enter those charges onto the tax roll as a special tax as provided by § 66.0907(5), Wis. Stats.
- F. Penalty. In addition to the provisions set forth in this section, any person, firm or corporation who or which violates the provisions of this section shall be subject to a penalty as provided in Chapter 1,§1-3 of theCode of Ordinances.
