It is hard to believe that the Fall colors are starting to pop already. I am sure there are many people who love this season as much as I do!

It is with sadness that we say goodbye to one of our Village family. Russ Glime passed on Saturday Sep. 2nd. He was one of our recycling attendants who was always there to offer a hand and conversation. Russ was more than just a Village employee, he was involved in our community as a leader in many groups. His passion for helping will be hard to replace. Russ made a difference and will be missed.

Lately there has been a lot of attention around PFAS (Polyfluoroalkyl Substances) and drinking water. PFAS, also known as forever chemicals, are a group of nearly 15,000 synthetic chemicals found in numerous products and manufacturing processes that have been linked to causing cancer. The Village Water Department tests our wells per DNR mandates for these chemicals on a routine basis and have found zero traces.

The Public Works department has been working on developing a plan to improve our water meter program. The committee recently decided to standardize the water meters for our water distribution system, and utilize the meter's built in smart capabilities which will send data automatically and also capture data in real time. This technology will allow the water department to pinpoint high water usage issues more efficiently. The plan will allow the Village to take a systematic approach which will eventually end up with all data being automatically sent to a central data/billing collection site, trigger high use alarms and other critical information on a per resident basis. This plan with take several years to fully implement and will involve some capital to implement but will ultimately allow us to provide a better service to our customers.

The Village is hoping to do another round of sidewalk rehabilitation later this fall. Phase 1 was completed earlier this summer and was a necessary investment as it has been many years since the Village has enforced our sidewalk ordinance. The future plan is to be proactive on this ordinance and stay on top our sidewalk maintenance plan as to not allow it to deteriorate to the level that it has in the past. Thank you to Maple Valley Insurance for embracing this plan with their extensive sidewalk work done along Main and East Railroad Streets.

The Village has made a few overdue upgrades. New asphalt has been put down in the in the parking area at the Village Hall and updates have been made to the Board room. Next phase of improvements will be to update existing lighting to LED technology and take advantage of Wisconsin Focus on Energy incentives and power savings.

A big thank you goes out to the Lena Lions Club for hosting another great Lena Dairyfest and the Dirt City organization for bringing another successful race weekend to our Village. These two events allow our Village to showcase who we are to numerous visitors!

As you drive though the village, notice how nice the planters along Main Street look. Thank you goes out to Linda Hinds and the Lena FFA green house for the beautiful display. They look great.

# **Park and Recs Announcement**

The Village of Lena Park and Rec Committee has been active in developing a plan for a dedicated area for a youth baseball park. This project is considered Phase 1 of the overall recreation project. Phase two and three will be announced in 2024. The Village has designated space along with funds to start development of two diamonds in the area of the water treatment plant near St. Anne's Parish property. Ground is in the process of being moved to form the diamonds with a goal of at least one field being playable in May of 2024, with the hope of having both diamonds ready at that time. ### Village Compost Pile

Please drop only leaves, grass clippings and garden waste. No plastic, branches, or garbage should be dropped on the compost pile.

### Garbage Pick Up Reminders

Curbside garbage pick-up in the Village is every Tuesday morning, by 8 am. Only garbage in "Village of Lena" marked bags will be picked up. These bags are available for purchase at the Lena Village Hall, Lena Library, or at the Recycle Center. Cost \$1.50 per bag.

There is a 40# limit in garbage bags and all bags must be tied.

Loose Leaf Collection—As a service for our residents, the Village will collect leaves directly from the curbside with our leaf vacuum. You do not have to dispose of leaves on your own. Leaf pick-up collection will begin when the leaves start falling, weekly, until November 15.



### **Collection Process:**

\*Do not place leaves in bags \*Leaves must be placed into piles within three feet of the curbside. Do not put piles into the street, gutter or over stormwater grates so as not to clog the storm drains.

\*Do not put brush, tree limbs, grass clippings, animal waste, or any other material into leaf piles

\*Vehicles should remain off the curbside on the day of pickup as the crew will not be able to gather leaves with vehicles in the way. \*Residents may still transport their leaves to the village compost site on their own if they wish.

#### Winter Reminders

If your property has a sidewalk along it, you are required to have the snow cleared within 24 hours (Village Ordinance 277-10.)

No vehicle is to be parked on the street between 2:30 A.M.—7 A.M., December 1-April1. If you have tenants that do not receive this notice please inform them. Parking citations will be issued for noncompliance. (Village Ordinance 302-16)
